# Need 2 Knows

## DONT PANIC!

- Panic is the first thing most people do when something spills and the first thought is to dump everything you have on it. DON'T! Leaving the spill for a few extra moments while you gather the things we're going to discuss can save you a LOT of time, money and stress in the long run. Trust us!
- Do NOT use dish soap, liquid laundry detergent, bleach or anything you have bought off the shelves labeled "carpet cleaner." These products do more harm than good.

## Things You'll Need

- White cotton towel is preferred but something to soak up the spill. (Make sure its not a new towel, it could bleed)
- Spray bottle (you can dump and rinse one of those store bought carpet cleaners if need be)
- One of these options: Vinegar, rubbing alcohol, sodium percarbonate (google it)
- Heavy object

Note: If you're working with very large spills and have a wet-dry vac available. Get it out.

## Recipe

1/2 TBS of one of the 3 options listed above in a 20oz spray bottle

## Step 1 (Liquid):



Grab that white cotton towel. Blot the spot and get up as much as possible. Our preference after blotting is to fold the towel, place it on the spot and apply weight (heavy object) over night OR until spot is completely dry. (This is very important. DRY!)

## Step 2:



Once the spot is completely dry, apply your spray mixture to the spot exceeding the spot by an inch or two. Do NOT soak it but spray liberally. Take the white cotton towel and lightly scrub. Add additional spray/repeat if needed. After repeating the process and spot is still there. Let it dry and repeat the process again.

## Step 1 (Solids):



Scoop up as much of the solid as possible and do nothing after. That's right, nothing! (This is very hard for some but again, trust us!) Let it dry completely. This usually takes a day or two. Afterwards, take your vacuum hose and scrape up what's left. Proceed to step 2 from here!

## Upholstery

- With most upholstery, follow the same process as described with carpet. Just make sure you test a discreet area first to make sure you won't be damaging anything. (This is very rare)
- Preferably spray an entire area (not just the spot) when dealing with upholstery. i.e. an entire couch cushion with a spot in the middle. This helps blend everything together instead of leaving water rings.

## Conclusion

- Always make sure to test a discreet area first with any material you're cleaning
- This process works on most materials, it is not a guarantee. If spot remains after, the spot is probably permanent
